Bardaisan (Syriac: ܒܪܕܝܫܢ‎ bar Daiṣān "son of the Daiṣān") was a Syriac author born on 11 July 154, in Edessa, Osroene, which, in those days, was alternately under the influence of both the Roman Empire and the Parthian Empire.To indicate the city of his birth, his parents called him "Son of the Daisan", the river on which Edessa was situated.

BARDAISAN. BARDAISAN (or Bardesanes) of Edessa (154 – 222 ce) was a philosopher, an ethnographer, and the first Syriac Christian theologian, later regarded as unorthodox.. Only a few events are known about the life of Bardaisan (Bar Day ṣ ā n, or "son of [the local river] Day ṣ ā n"). He attended the court of the king of Edessa, Abgar VIII (176 – 211), and probably fled from Edessa ...

Scarcely anything survives of his writings, for a Dialogue concerning Fate, extant in Syriac under the title "Book of the Laws of the Countries," is by his disciple Philip. The 56 Hymns of Ephrem Syrus against Heresies are intended to refute the doctrines of Marcion, Bardaisan, and Mari, but Ephrem's criticism is harsh and unintelligent.

Eusebius records in his Ecclesiastical History that Bardaisan's disciples translated his dialogues from Syriac into Greek, 21 and we may assume that the Book of the Laws was among these treatises so that the dialogue would have been available to Greek readers from a very early time.

By the early third century, and during his own lifetime, Bardaisan had a reputation for criticizing the religious views of Marcion and Valentinus. 17 Some ancient authors maintain that he had at some point embraced Valentinian views, but scholars have challenged the premise. 18 On the basis of the early third-century testimony, Bardaisan's works refuting Marcion and Valentinus can be plausibly situated as having been written early in his career, perhaps even during the reign of Marcus Aurelius.

John's disciples bury him upon his death and remain active in Acts (18:25-26; 19:1-7). Not surprisingly, there is even a little tension between the followers of Jesus and John (Matt. 9:14). Discipleship in the New Testament (though the actual word "discipleship" is never used) usually means learning from a teacher.

**The Life and Times of the Disciples (Following Jesus ...**

The Dyophysite party ("two-natures of Jesus"), led by Diodorus of Tarsus, Theodoret, and their disciples, had achieved prominence in Church and scholarly circles of Mesopotamia. Guided by Nestorius, these scholars struggled against the Monophysite party ("single-nature of Jesus"), led by Cyril of Alexandria and his disciples.
