Project Documents. Project Documents include project charter, statement of work, contracts, requirements documentation, stakeholder register, change control register, activity list, quality metrics, risk register, issue log, and other similar documents. These may not be included in a project management plan, however, are an integral part of the project.

Project Documents | Project Management Professional (PMP)

For a software development project, for example, you might define components called “Database”, “Usability”, “Documentation” (note that issues can belong to more than one component). You can choose a Default Assignee for each component, which is useful if you have different people leading different sub-teams in your project.

It will outline the objectives, benefits, scope, delivery method, structure and governance in order to deliver the required changes.

Lack of clarity is a common source of project stress and failure. A vague or ambiguous scope document leaves many issues open to debate and uninformed judgment calls. These can impact the features, quality, timing, and cost of the project.

The System Design Document is a required document for every project. It should include a high level description of why the System Design Document has been created, provide what the new system is intended for or is intended to replace and contain detailed descriptions of the architecture and system components....
